NATJA Coming in 2017The 2017 North American Travel Journalis

The 2017 North American Travel Journalists Association 15th Annual Conference & Marketplace will convene in Orange County, NC from May 15-19, 2017. The host hotel is the Sheraton Chapel Hill. The event brings together travel journalists from throughout the US, Canada and Mexico for a combination of business meetings, educational seminars and a media marketplace. It also provides a perfect showcase for Chapel Hill and the surrounding areas through

activities and events scheduled each afternoon and evening.

The Chapel Hill/Orange County Visitors Bureau's bid was selected to host this prestigious group and it was a countywide effort. Officials from Carrboro, Hillsborough, Chapel Hill and UNC were all involved in the initial site tour provided for NATJA's CEO. Hotel News

Chapel Hill's The Franklin Hotel won Hilton's 2016 "Connie Award" for the Curio brand. This award is given to the #1 hotel globally in each of Hilton's brands every year, based on their quality assurance audits and combined performance in Overall Guest Experience and Overall Guest Service. There were 18 hotels (still a new brand) in the Curio Collection worldwide during 2015. The prestigious Connie Award

(photo) is named after Hilton Worldwide's founder Conrad Hilton.

Construction will begin within a month on the OTO Development, 4-story AC Marriott hotel with 123 guest rooms and 2 levels of below grade parking (112 spaces) at 210 West Rosemary Street. The Hotel's construction, which will be adjacent to La Residence restaurant, is anticipated to last approximately 14 months with a Fall 2017 opening. The General Contractor for the project will be Lend Lease (US) Construction. During construction pedestrian traffic will be re-routed to the South Side of Rosemary Street to maintain pedestrian safety.

Work continues on the 110-room, five-story Southern Village Hyatt Place which will be located on 15-501 South, adjacent to Southern Village and near the entrance to Market Street. Officials say a February 2017 opening is possible.



The Farm to Fork picnic is in a field next to the W.C. Breeze Farm Extension & Research Center at 4909 Walnut Grove Church Road in Hurdle Mills, NC - a few miles north of Hillsborough.
