At the age of 20, Norton started a non-profit organization, the SCI CAN Foundation, to help others with spinal cord injuries and other neurological disorders as well giving motivational speeches throughout the Midwest to thousands of individuals. Norton has received many honors including being named the 2011 CBS Courage in Sports People's Choice Award winner, appearing live on the CBS Early Show, throwing out the first pitch at a Minnesota Twins game, recognized in 2012 by the American Red Cross as one of the Heroes of the Heartland, and recently listed in the Iowa Hall of Pride as one of Iowa's Heroes.

Des Moines Mayor T.M. Franklin Cownie was elected to the seat in January 2004 and was re-elected in January 2008.
