

Looking for free fun in Fort Wayne this summer? We've compiled the list of all the free things you can do this summer!

- 1. Catch a free outdoor family-friendly film every Wednesday night all summer long at the <u>Foellinger Theatre Summer Movie Series</u>.
- 2. Bike the <u>Rivergreenway Trail</u>, a 25-mile long linear park that runs along the riverbanks of the St. Joseph, St. Marys and Maumee Rivers. The Rivergreenway traverses the city, connecting to 15 city parks!
- 3. Browse the newest exhibit at the <u>Fort</u> <u>Wayne Museum of Art</u> with free admission on Thursdays from 5-8 p.m.
- 4. Listen to great local music at a <u>Friday Nites</u> <u>Live</u> concert every Friday of the summer from 6:30 8:30 p.m at Jefferson Pointe.
- 5. 18. Uncover great local food at 14 farmers markets open Wednesdays,
   Thursdays, and Saturdays! Explore visitfortwayne.com/farmersmarkets for times.
- 19. Hear a free concert at Rock the Plaza on the Downtown Library Campus every Saturday night at 6 p.m.
- 20. Celebrate the street performer at <a href="Buskerfest">Buskerfest</a> on June 25 from 4 10 p.m. on Wayne and Calhoun Streets.
- 21. Explore <u>Kids Crossing</u>, <u>Taylor's Dream</u> and our 53 other playgrounds.

- 22. Enjoy <u>Last Saturdays</u> (by the Downtown Improvement District) on the last Saturday of every month and participate in free or half-priced events all over downtown.
- 23. Browse the U.S.'s largest public genealogy collection at the Allen County Public Library Downtown.
- 24- 33. Make a <u>splash</u> at one of Fort Wayne's 10 Splash Pads: Buckner, Kreager, Shoaff, Swinney Park (coming soon), Memorial, McCormick, Waynedale, Shoaff, Headwaters, Robert E. Meyers or Franklin Park (coming soon).
- 34. Examine historical documents at the <u>Karpeles Museum</u>.
- 35. Browse antiques at any one of the local antique shops.
- 36. Browse the ever-changing exhibits at Artlink Contemporary Gallery.
- 37. Stroll the sacred at the <u>Cathedral</u> <u>Museum and Bookstore</u>.
- 38. Catch one of the many events like the parade, bed races, children's fest and more at the week-long <u>Three Rivers Festival</u> from July 8 16.

- 39. Grab lunch at your favorite local restaurant or food truck and enjoy a free concert and other events at <u>Lunch on the Plaza</u> at Freimann Square every Thursday from 11:30 a.m. 1:30 p.m.
- 40. Enjoy artwork in a beautiful setting at Castle Gallery located in the beautiful historic West Central Neighborhood (closed Sundays and Mondays).
- 41. Explore the <u>Allen County Public Library</u> one of the best in the nation! Kids love the downtown branch, complete with reading nooks, aquariums, a toddler play area and free programming all summer long.
- 42. Soak in the history at the <u>Old Fort</u>; the grounds are open to visitors every day with special programming monthly.
- 43. Tour the <u>Little River Wetlands</u> sites to see native plants and animals.
- 44. Visit the Fort Wayne Railroad Historical Society and hop aboard one of the last operating steam locomotives in the world: Nickel Plate Road No. 765. Open Saturday 10 a.m. 4 p.m. and Sunday 12 4 p.m.
- 45. Shop the <u>Paradigm Gallery</u> at the Fort Wayne Museum of Art or join them for 2nd Thursdays (on the second Thursday of every month), a unique experience featuring demonstrations and designer trunk shows from Paradigm Artists. (Free admission, cash bar, light edibles)
- 46. Go <u>stargazing</u> with the Fort Wayne Astronomical Society on Saturday nights one hour after sunset and continuing for two hours at Jefferson Township Park.
- 47. Shop in the sun and throw pennies in the fountain at <u>Jefferson Pointe</u>.

- 48. Celebrate diversity at the Fort Wayne Pride Festival on July 22 - 23 at Headwaters Park.
- 49. Check out the free events like <u>Jazz Jam</u> (every first Thursday of the month) or just take a tour at Sweetwater Sound, one of the nation's leading musical instrument and sound retailers.
- 50. Attend one of the Fort Wayne Youtheatre's free <u>Storybook Theatre</u> shows, with performances on July 6, 9, 10,11, 13, 23, 27, and August 27 at various locations.
- 51. Roam the <u>St. Joe Pickle Festival</u> from July 21 23.
- 52. Enjoy shopping and the free indoor play area at Glenbrook Mall.
- 53. Immerse in the arts culture with 70 live performances of theatre, music and dance on 10 stages, Fort Artisan Arts Fair, hands-on activities, Buskers around the fountain and all day artists markets at the <u>Taste of the Arts</u> on August 26 and 27 at the Downtown Arts Campus.
- 54. Delight your taste buds at <u>BBQ RibFest</u> at Headwaters Park with free admission until 5:30 p.m. on Thursday, June 16 Saturday, June 18 and all day Sunday.
- 55. Browse the fine art at Orchard Gallery.
- 56. Celebrate Independence Day with free Fourth of July fireworks.
- 57. Tour the Amish community in <u>Grabill</u>, <u>Indiana</u>.
- 58. Celebrate Greek culture, cuisine and entertainment at <u>Greekfest</u> at Headwaters Park June 23 26 with free admission after 4 p.m. and all day Sunday.

- 59. Take the kids out to <u>eat for free</u> at one of the many restaurants where kids eat free.
- 60. Visit the breathtaking <u>Allen County</u> <u>Courthouse</u> (cell phones and cameras not admitted). Group tours available by appointment Monday Friday 8 a.m. 4:30 p.m. or you can take the <u>self-guided tour</u>.
- 61. Explore southwest Fort Wayne on the 18 miles of hilly Aboite Trails.
- 62. Walk through <u>Lindenwood Cemetery</u> and visit the graves of many of Fort Wayne's founders
- 63. Take a trip to the <u>Grabill Country Fair</u> from September 8 10, a country-style fair that highlights the area's Amish Heritage with food, crafts, kids events and much more!
- 64. Enjoy a <u>free</u> concert courtesy of Living Fort Wayne every first Wednesday of the month of June, July and August at 5 p.m. at Headwaters Park.
- 65. Catch a <u>free outdoor movie</u> every Saturday night at 7 p.m. with the Living Fort Wayne Film Series (at various locations).
- 66. Venture through the stacks at the <u>Hyde</u> Brothers.
- 67. Browse modern art at <u>Wunderkammer</u> (open 1 8 p.m. Thursday Sunday).
- 68. Attend Be a Tourist in Your Own

  Hometown on Sunday, September 11 from
  12 5 p.m. (held annually on the Sunday after
  Labor Day) with free admission to a dozen
  museums and attractions.
- 69. Grab a bike or take off on foot and tour the <u>Sculpture With Purpose around</u> <u>Downtown!</u>

- 70. Enjoy the <u>Indiana Native Tree Walk</u> on the IPFW Campus.
- 71. Visit <u>Parkview Field</u> it is open as a public park on days when there are no games or events!
- 72. Pique your interest with classic cars, swap meets, parades or antiques at the <u>Auburn Cord Duesenberg Festival</u> in Downtown Auburn from August 28 September 5.
- 73. Walk or run the historic 5.5 mile <u>Towpath Trail</u>, weaving through beautiful neighborhoods, scenic marshlands and near areas of commerce. This trail connects to both the Rivergreenway and Aboite Trails.
- 74. Take your pooch to Pawster Park.
- 75. Pick up a <u>Downtown Walking Tour map</u> and explore the modern heart of Fort Wayne.
- 76. Visit Northside Galleries to see fine art from local, national and international artists in 2 and 3 dimensions (closed Saturday and Sunday).
- 77. Experience historical Fort Wayne with the Downtown Historic Walking Tour.
- 78. Visit the <u>Lindenwood Nature Preserve</u> and hike all of their beautiful trails: the Trillium Trail, the Oak Paradise Trail, the Trail of Reflection and the Maple Spur Trail (they're all a mile or less!).
- 79. Pick up a map and hit the <u>ARCH Heritage</u> Trail.
- 80. Grab your skateboard or skates and show off your skills at <u>Lawton's Skatepark</u>.

- 82. Visit <u>Creative Women</u> of the World to learn about Fort Wayne's global impact on women in poverty and shop their fine artisan products.
- 82. Celebrate the Fourth of July at the <u>Fort Wayne Philharmonic Patriotic Pops</u> concert on July 3 at 8:30 p.m. at Parkview Field.
- 83. Play frisbee golf at <u>Swinney</u> and <u>Shoaff</u> Parks.
- 84. Tour the <u>History Center</u> during free admission times on Saturdays from 9 a.m. 1 p.m. (during the Farmers' Market).
- 85. Peruse the <u>five galleries</u> at the University of Saint Francis: the Weatherhead Gallery, the Goldfish Gallery, the Artist Spotlight Gallery, the Lupke Gallery and the Rolland Gallery.
- 86-88. Surround yourself with beauty in Fort Wayne's <u>public gardens</u> at Lakeside Garden, Foster Gardens, Freimann Gardens and many other small parks around the city.
- 89. Enjoy local fine art alongside your morning coffee at <u>Old Crown Coffee Roasters</u>, <u>Mocha Lounge</u>, <u>Firefly Coffee House</u> and Fortezza Coffee.
- 90. Tour the <u>Hamilton Sculpture Garden</u>, a tribute garden to Emerine Hamilton, near the banks of the St. Mary's River in Headwaters Park.
- 91. Play at <u>Salomon Farm Park</u> and run the 1.65-mile loop around the park and the Parkview YMCA.
- 92. Enjoy a free concert from the Fort Wayne Area Community Band at the Foellinger Theater on June 14, July 12 and August 9 at 7:30 p.m.

- 93. Explore the 13 miles long <u>Pufferbelly</u> rail-to-trail, a trail located on a former railroad right of way.
- 94-103 Stop at the <u>Visitors Center</u> and get maps to tour the ten historic districts in Fort Wayne: Williams-Woodland Park, Columbia Avenue, Forest Park Boulevard, Foster Park Neighborhood, Illsley Place-West Rudisill, Indian Village, Lafayette Place, Oakdale, Shawnee Place and Wildwood Park.
- 104. Complement your Williams-Woodland Park Historic District Tour with the Historic Beltline Tour, which you can also pick up from the Visitors Center.
- 105. Enjoy cutting-edge artists performances at the <u>Fringe Festival</u> at Wunderkammer from July 31 August 7.
- 106. Grab food from your favorite food trucks and enjoy live music from local bands and beer gardens at the Fort Wayne Foodstock on July 30 from 11 a.m. 8 p.m. at the Indiana Michigan Power Center Plaza.
- 107. Browse the <u>Covington Art Fair</u> at the Covington Plaza on June 25 26, a high-quality community event featuring fine arts.
- 108. Take a tour of Fort Wayne from the free <u>Historic Boat Tours</u> happening almost every other Sunday now through October.
- 109. Round off your summer by celebrating one of Fort Wayne's favorite historical figures at the <u>Johnny Appleseed</u> Festival on September 17 18.
