


- Home to more than 500 species of animals and several indoor and outdoor exhibits, the **Fort Worth Zoo** provides an entire day of fun for all families. The zoo also houses the country's premier herpetarium, the Museum of Living Art (MOLA).
- Get outside and explore the Fort Worth Nature Center and Refuge. A great place to enjoy hiking, canoeing and kayaking, the area boasts more than 3,600 acres of forests, prairies and wetlands. Native critters such as beavers and ducks may pay you a visit as well.



- Get a dose of western history by visiting the National Cowgirl Museum and Hall of Fame, the only museum in the world dedicated to honoring trailblazing women of the American West. The museum includes interactive exhibits, rare photographs and fascinating artifacts telling the stories of famous cowgirls from Annie Oakley to Jessie the Cowgirl from Toy Story.
- Enjoy an old-fashioned dip in a spring-fed pool at Burger's Lake, a 30-acre park featuring two sandy beaches, six diving boards, a 20-foot slide, and a 25-foot trapeze all monitored by certified lifeguards. Over 300 picnic tables and charcoal grills are on site, providing plenty of amenities for a big family get-together.
- Hands-on adventurers should head to the Fort Worth Museum of Science and History, where parents have as much fun as the kids. Whether it's crawling around a massive sandbox for fossils, exploring light and color in the Designer Studio, or catching a show at the OmniTheater (an IMAX dome) or the Noble Planetarium, no one will leave disappointed.





• Everyone, age nine to 90, will enjoy the **Stockyards Championship Rodeo**, every Friday and Saturday night at 8 p.m. in the Cowtown Coliseum featuring bull riding, barrel racing and calf roping. During certain seasons catch **Pawnee Bill's Wild West Show** showcasing trick roping, riding, and shooting and singing cowboys.
